Dear IWIN Community,

This summer, IWIN has launched a bold new chapter. Inspired by Mexican artist Elina Chauvet's iconic Red Shoes installation, we have officially kicked off our fourth global art call—the 25 Shoes / 25 Cities project for 2025—and already, cities across the U.S., Canada, Europe, Australia, and New Zealand have stepped forward to join us.

On November 25, 2025, each participating city will place 25 pairs of red shoes in a public space, honoring women in Iran and Afghanistan whose lives have been taken by gender-based violence.

- ► Each pair of shoes = one silenced life
- 🏶 Each city = a symbolic twin to a city in Iran or Afghanistan
- Each act = a step toward a world where women live free and unafraid




A Global Art Call to END violence against Women in Iran, Afghanistan, and Across the Middle East

While borders and power divide us, our wounds are often the same. This movement calls us to rise together from mourning to meaning, from silence to solidarity.






WEEKLY PROGRAM: VIRTUAL FARSI FREE


IWIN Monthly Moments July
